## Section 8. Public Health and Safety Outcomes

The optimization of dispensaries as well as the scalability of their implementation should NOT add notable public health risks

- Majority of the cannabis-related public health outcomes evaluated in this study are comparable to 25 states surveyed in April of 2022 (illicit, medical-only, and adult use states).
- However, there is significant room for improvement on these outcomes
- May of these outcomes may be addressed and improved through dedicated education and outreach campaigns



# Driving under the influence of cannabis

37% of cannabis consumers report having driven under the influence in the past month, averaging 11 days per month



### **Problematic Cannabis Use**

38% of cannabis consumers demonstrated problematic cannabis use patterns



### Consume Cannabis Before or During Work

36% of cannabis consumers report consuming cannabis before or during work hours

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# **NSC Definition and Approach**

"Workplace impairment is the inability to function normally or safely as a result of a number of factors – from chemical substances, such as alcohol, opioids or cannabis, to physical factors like fatigue, as well as experiencing mental distress and social factors like stress."





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# **Safety Impact**

- Impairment from any cause is a fitness for duty concern!
- Effects:
  - Reduced ability to concentrate and think clearly
  - Decreased coordination and sensory perception
  - · Slower reaction time
  - Other psychological impacts personality changes, mood changes, or irritability
  - · Changes in workplace behaviors and performance



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# Safety Sensitive Position

- A job or position where the employee holding this position has the responsibility for his or her own safety or the safety of others
- "Safety sensitive position" means a position subject to drug and alcohol testing because the nature of the employee's duties and responsibilities indicate a potential that impaired performance due to drugs or alcohol, or both, could result in injury or death to the employee or others.

# **Testing cannot be arbitrary**

- You must observe
  - Appearance.
  - Behavior.
  - Speech.
  - Odors.
- You must be able to explain and document your reasons.
- You cannot send a employee for testing based on another's observations.
